

## **Public Consultation Process**

The Low Pay Commission is an independent body, the main function of which is to advise the Government on the appropriate rate of the National Minimum Wage.

The Commission has also been requested to examine certain related matters, during the course of 2016, in particular to examine the appropriateness of the sub-minima rates which currently apply to young people, with regard to their impact on youth employment rates and participation in education, and to examine the issues surrounding the preponderance of women on the National Minimum Wage and the underlying causes.

In this regard the Commission is now seeking submissions from interested parties in relation to these matters.

- The appropriateness of the current sub-minima rates with regard to their impact on youth unemployment rates and participation in education – Closing Date Friday 8<sup>th</sup> January 2016
- 2. The National Minimum Wage Closing Date Friday 11<sup>th</sup>
  March 2016
- 3. The underlying reasons for the preponderance of women on minimum wage Closing Date Friday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2016
