Summary

Dr Patricia Scanlon was appointed Ireland's first AI Ambassador, following an <u>open call</u> for expressions of interest. The role was established under Strand 1 of the <u>National AI Strategy</u>, <u>"Here for Good"</u>, the objective of which is to develop, build and facilitate strong public trust in AI as a force for societal good. The role of the AI Ambassador includes leading a national conversation on the role of AI in our lives, emphasising Ireland's commitment to an ethical approach to the use of the technology and in particular its adoption by enterprise.

The AI Ambassador is a member of the <u>Enterprise Digital Advisory Forum</u>, established under Strand 3 of the AI Strategy. In her first year in the role, Dr Scanlon has participated in a large number of engagements with media, young people, businesses and other stakeholders to demystify AI and champion its potential as a positive force. Dr Scanlon will continue in the role for a second and final year until May 2024.

Policy Work and Advice

As part of her role, Dr Scanlon has contributed expert policy advice to Government through regular updates to the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment and other Departments. Dr Scanlon is a member of both the Enterprise Digital Advisory Forum and the Working Group to develop principles and guidelines for the trustworthy and ethical use of Al in the Public Service.

UNESCO/OECD and International Engagement

On of the highlights of Dr Scanlon's first year as AI Ambassador was <u>her visit to Paris</u> in April 2023 for high-level meetings on AI with the OECD and UNESCO. The visit also included meeting innovative AI companies at the Station F start-up incubator and a meeting with the French National AI Coordinator.

The purpose of the visit was for Dr Scanlon to meet with some of the leading policy makers and researchers in the field of AI at a time of rapid developments in AI. Both the OECD and UNESCO have very important roles in terms of developing global recommendations for ethical AI and provide a huge amount of assistance to policy makers.

The visit was also an opportunity to highlight Ireland's ethical and human centric approach to AI while at the same time building public trust and confidence in the technology and demystifying it.

During her visit Dr Scanlon met Gabriela Ramos, Assistant Director-General for Social and Human Sciences for UNESCO as well as senior officials from the OECD Science Technology and Education Directorates. The visit contributed to raising Ireland's profile on these issues at the OECD and UNESCO while also focussing on key issues such as women in technology and development. In March 2023, Dr Scanlon participated in a roundtable discussion alongside the Minister for Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science, Simon Harris TD, in San Francisco with representatives from Enterprise Ireland and Silicon Valley tech leaders to discuss AI benefits and its impacts across society, industry and Government as well as regulation and AI ethics.

National Youth Assembly

Dr Scanlon participated in the <u>National Youth Assembly on AI</u> which took place in October 2022 in the Tangent Ideaspace in Trinity College. The event brought together young people from around the country to engage in workshops on AI, and to then put forth their own recommendations to Government. Dr Scanlon also participated in the preparatory session for the youth delegates in advance of the Assembly.

Participants attended a series of workshops delivered by experts across each of four strands identified as particularly relevant for young people. These were: AI and Society, A Governance Ecosystem that Promotes Trustworthy AI, AI Serving the Public, and AI in Education, Skills and Talent. Dr Scanlon facilitated one of the workshops and was on-hand to discuss issues raised by the delegates.

The report and recommendations from the National Youth Assembly will ensure that the views of young people in Ireland on AI are recorded and considered as we look towards the future of AI in Ireland.
