- Improve the policy process, reduce complexity of rules and administrative burden
- Take concrete steps to realize a coherent and digital data sharing and reporting landscape
- Adapt the NLF framework to make it future-proof
- Tackle challenges in the e-commerce sector
- Evaluate possibilities for eliminating territorial supply constraints
- Cut at least 25% of reporting obligations by 2025

- Clear follow-up of complaints from businesses

Market Strategy

Rebooting the free movement of services and professionals

- Screen and evaluate national procedures on proportionality, complexity, and costs
- Identify barriers as part of a structural and continuous mapping exercise
- Publish a Handbook for Digital Service Providers to examine potential overlapping and conflicting digital regulations
- Simplify the notification of posted workers in the EU through digitalisation of procedures
- Facilitate professional mobility and resolve skills gap
- Increase the visibility of IMI
