<sup>3</sup> Enterprise Ireland has engaged with 4,500 companies in relation to COVID-19. For many, the first step is to obtain the Business Financial Planning Grant which assists companies to understand their immediate financial position, secure the finance required to survive and provide a framework to sustain the business. EI have to date received 618 applications for the Business Financial Planning Grant and are already actively working with 130 companies to put together applications for support under the Sustaining Enterprise Fund. Over the coming weeks and months, EI expects that many applications for Financial Planning Grants will transpire into Sustaining Enterprise Fund applications. EI actively engage and work with all applicants on a one to one basis to ensure they get the right support at the right time.
